The award is to be given to a candidate who has secured highest percent of marks in the qualifying examination on the basis of which the candidate has been admitted to the B.Lib.Sc. Course in the University of Delhi during the preceding year. The award carries (Rs.1000/only).

ILA - DR. K PADMA UMAPATHY AND KS UMAPATHY FELLOWSHIP IN LIBRARY & INFO. SCIENCE 2016

Five Fellowships worth Rs.2000/- each are to be awarded annually out of the accrued interest on certain sum of deposit with ILA. The money has been donated by Dr. K.S.Umapathy, former Professor of Library and Information Science and Librarian of the Bangalore University. These Fellowships are given to the students doing M.L.I.Sc. from a recognized university. At least three Fellowships will be awarded to the woman candidate provided they satisfy the following conditions.

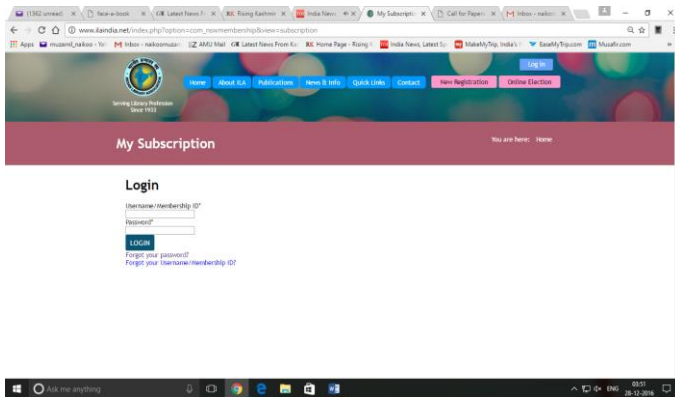
Free Accessibility to JILA

• 15 libraries chosen for 'Small Libraries Create Smart Spaces' project

On 1st December 2016, Fifteen small U.S. public libraries have been selected to participate in the "Small Libraries Create Smart Spaces" a two year project led by OCLC in partnership with the Association for Rural and Small Libraries (ARSL) and funded by a National Leadership Grant from the Institute of Museum and Library Services. The selected libraries have been chosen from 106 completed application located in 12 different states and serve communities ranging in size from 1,000 to 21,000 people. The selected libraries are:

1. Bertha Voyer Memorial Library, Honey Grove, Texas, population served 1,670
2. Caledonia Public Library, Caledonia, Minnesota, population served 6,319
3. Cornwall Public Library, Cornwall, New York, population served 16,841
4. Glens Ferry Public Library, Glens Ferry, Idaho, population served 1,100
5. Greenwich Free Library, Greenwich, New York, population served 4,942
6. Hot Springs Library, Hot Springs, North Carolina, population served 560 (21,157 in county)
7. Ignacio Community Library, Ignacio, Colorado, population served 5950 (town 750, district 5,200)
8. James Kennedy Public Library, Dyersville, Iowa, population served 5,000
9. Madison Public Library, Madison, South Dakota, population served 12,622
10. Norelius Community Library, Denison, Iowa, population served 8,298
11. Punxsutawney Memorial Library, Punxsutawney, Pennsylvania, population served 15,760
12. Ronan Library District, Ronan, Montana, population served 8,645
13. Town Creek Public Library, Town Creek, Alabama, population served 1,080
14. Tucker Free Library, Henniker, New Hampshire, population served 4,900
15. Wilton Public and Gregg Free Library, Wilton, New Hampshire, population served 3,400

A member of the selected libraries will be guided through a training program designed by WebJunction, the learning program of OCLC Research. Participants will apply what they learn to re-imagine and re-configure library space to support socially engaging and active learning programming that addresses a defined community need. WebJunction Director Said that, "These libraries were chosen based on a well-articulated understanding of their communities, commitment to championing economic and educational success, and an enthusiasm for bringing the voice of community members to their planning process".

Over an 18-month period, participants will be introduced to the principles of place making, community engagement and human-centered space design. After conducting community input, action planning and prototype activities, the libraries will implement a learning space using a starter set of materials.

• Kindle to support e-books in five Indian languages @ Hindi, Tamil, Marathi, Gujarati and Malayalam

Kindle an Amazon's e-book reader will now support content in five Indian languages, those are Hindi, Tamil, Marathi, Gujarati and Malayalam. "We are adding thousands of digital books in Hindi, Tamil, Marathi, Gujarati and Malayalam, including the largest digital selection of best sellers, hundreds of exclusive titles and free classics to the Kindle Book Store," Amazon Kindle Director (Content) Sanjeev Jha told PTI.

Readers can access these books on Kindle eReaders as well as the free Kindle apps for Android and iOS.

"We are bringing features like font size adjustment, ability to add notes and highlights, and automatic save and sync of your furthest page read across all your devices," he said.

According to industry reports, the print book market in India is estimated to be worth about USD 4 billion. India ranks third in English language publishing, after the US and the UK. India, which is one of the fastest growing Smartphone markets globally, also has a significant number of people reading e-books on their phones.

- **INFLIBNET added 30 Lakhs+ e-books to their NLIST collection**

Inflibnet has added the World E-Book Library to its NLIST collection through which more the 30 lakhs books will remain available to NLIST users through the consortia. The details of the news are available at: <http://nlist.inflibnet.ac.in/index.php>.

- **New technique to prevent illegal copying of photos, videos & Books**

Scientists have developed an innovative light-based technique to create secure, invisible watermarks that can be used to prevent photos, videos and books from being illegally copied and distributed. "In our research, we use a complex pattern of light, or diffraction pattern, as a unique watermark," said Yishi Shi, from the University of Chinese Academy of Sciences, China.

"The invisible watermark is embedded into the content we are trying to protect. Imperceptibility is one of the most significant advantages of optical watermarking," said Shi. The new approach encodes the optical watermark in a single step. It is faster and uses a less complex optical setup than other optical watermarking approaches previously pursued, researchers said.

The technique can also be used to optically encrypt data or to hide information within images. The method is based on a technique called Single-shot Photography Encoding (SPE) that uses multiple partially-overlapping beams of light to generate a diffraction pattern from a complex object. Unlike other methods, SPE can encode the optical watermark in a single exposure with no mechanical scanning.

For cases where the presence of a watermark is unknown, the watermark could be extracted using existing algorithm-based detection methods.

- **HathiTrust Research Center (HTRC) Extracted Features (EF) Dataset, Version 1.0**

HathiTrust announced the release of a significantly expanded open dataset, the HathiTrust Research Center (HTRC) Extracted Features (EF) Dataset, Version 1.0. This dataset provides researchers with open access to data extracted from the full text of the HathiTrust Digital Library (HTDL) at an unprecedented scale.

The Extracted Features Dataset opens the complete HathiTrust collection for investigations into historical and cultural trends, the rise and fall of topics within the corpus, and the evolution of words and writing structures in publications dating from the 16th to the late 20th century. It provides quantitative information about word and line counts, parts of speech, and other details within each page of every volume in the HTDL. In addition to these larger-scale investigations, the EF Dataset also allows researchers to closely analyze the contents of a given volume or subset of volumes.

The data is extracted from 13.7 million volumes found in the HTDL, representing over 5 billion pages consisting of over two trillion tokens (words). A preliminary release of the EF Dataset, drawn from a much smaller subset comprising only HathiTrust's public domain collection, has already enabled novel research from scholars in economics, history, linguistics, literary studies and sociology, among other fields.

Founded in 2008 and hosted at the University of Michigan, HathiTrust preserves and provides access to millions of digitized books and journals from the collections of more than 120 institutional academic and research partners via its certified trusted digital repository. This searchable archive of published literature from around the world includes both in-copyright and public domain materials from mass digitization programs and partners' local digitization initiatives.

The HathiTrust Research Center is an advanced research service of HathiTrust and a collaborative research center launched jointly by Indiana University and the University of Illinois. The Research Center team strives to meet the technical challenges that researchers face when dealing with massive amounts of digital text, by developing cutting-edge software tools and cyber infrastructure to enable advanced computational access to the growing digital record of human knowledge. 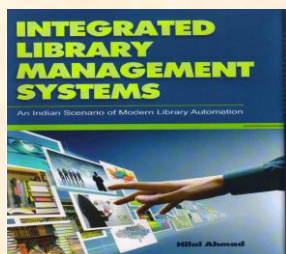

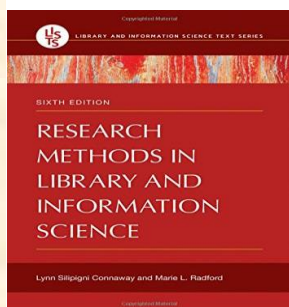

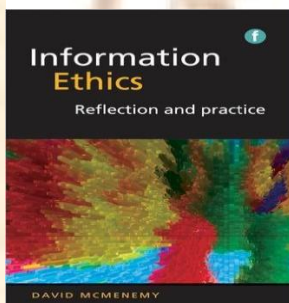
Book Publications
