MINUTES OF THE SECOND EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING OF THE INDIAN LIBRARY ASSOCIATION (ILA) (2016-2019)

Held on 07th AUGUST, 2016

The 2nd meeting of the Indian Library Association (ILA) Executive Committee (2016-2019) was held on Sunday, the 07 August, 2016 at 2.30 p.m. in the Central Library, University of Delhi, Delhi.

Proceedings

Prof. Shabhat Husain welcomed all the members of the Executive Committee. President updated the house regarding written request to Honorable Lt. Governor of Delhi for land allotment for ILA. As the same was not responded, the house was of the opinion to send a reminder and also seek an appointment with H.E. Lt. Governor so that a delegation of ILA members may apprise him of the problems being faced by ILA. While appreciating the team spirit of the present Office bearers, Prof. Shabhat Husain, President provided the details of development of a dynamic web-site of ILA. He also urged every member to go through the site and send his feedback. At the same time, he requested the house to make efforts regarding advertisements from Book Vendors, Publishers, and Library Software companies for the ILA web-site. He also appreciated the efforts made by sub-committee for office Junk (Raddi etc.) to take up the daunting task of clearing Junk from the office of ILA and selling the same for an amount of Rs 9,871/-, which have been deposited in the official ILA account.

The following business was transacted as per the agenda of the meeting:-

Agenda Item No. 1: Confirmation of minutes of the 1st Executive Committee held on 26 May 2016 in Central Library, Delhi University, Delhi-7, circulated through e-mail to all members. No comment was received and the house approved the same.

Agenda Item No. 2: IFLA money related matter

Dr. Pardeep Rai, General Secretary updated the house regarding IFLA money that was fortunately released after a long and arduous legal battle. The drafts of amount of Rs 2,63,24176.40/- has been deposited in the account of Indian Library Association on 21st June 2016. An amount of Rs 5,30,000/- was later on paid to Mr. Narender Prabhakar, Advocate as his fee for fighting the case on behalf of ILA.

The house further discussed the ways and means for investment of this amount on higher interest rate. Decision was taken to find out the details of interest from various private banks like ICICI, HDFC, Tata or any other bank as well. In the meantime, a sum of Rs 2,58,00000/- (i.e. two crore fifty eight lacs only) may be deposited as Fixed Deposit with Maharashtra Bank for three months.

Agenda Item No. 3: Finalization of 62nd ILA Conference.

The General Secretary informed the house that Dr. P.S. Rajput, Assistant Librarian, Mohanlal Sukhadia University: Maharana Bhupal Campus, Udaipur, in continuation of his earlier e-mail to organize the ILA conference has expressed his inability for organizing the ILA conference due to some administrative reasons. Further, a request for organizing the next ILA conference was received from Prof. P. G. Tadasad, Professor and Chairman, Department of Library and Information Science, Special Officer to Vice Chancellor and Coordinator Legal Cell, Karnataka State Women's University, Jnanashakti, Torvi Vijayapura - 586108, in the-

-last week of June, 2016. The guidelines for hosting ILA conference had already been sent to him. The confirmation of acceptance of guidelines through email had been received on 31st July 2016, with the approval of University administration. House advised the General Secretary to inform Prof. Tadasad through a formal acceptance letter, with a request that the theme of the conference with exact dates of proposed Conference may also be finalized by him at the earliest so that necessary announcement etc. may be made without any delay.

Agenda Item No. 4: Re-organization of 'Journal of Indian Library Association' (JILA):

The issues pertaining to JILA (like free copy to ILA members, frequency of publication, online publication, out sourcing the publication and distribution etc.) were discussed in detail. House agreed to change its frequency from quarterly to half yearly subject to the approval by the General Body as per laid down procedure. With regard to outsourcing of publication of JILA, main hurdle was the supply of free copy to all Ordinary and Life members as it was getting too unwieldy. In the same context, resolutions had earlier been made in the General Body meetings held at Jindal Open University, Sonapat and at Dharwad in 2013 but could not be implemented, somehow.

The house was of the opinion that the JILA copies should be got printed only for the subscribers, whereas Life members of ILA should be provided online access in a restricted mode (i.e. not-downloadable). President was authorized to work out the details. It was decided to bring the issue of restricting duration of Life membership in the next meeting of E.C.

Agenda Item No. 5: To consider the draft of representation to UGC Pay Review Committee:

President ILA had requested all the Library professionals in India through various forums including ILA web site to send their suggestions to ILA for representing the issues related to their Salary scales, Designation, Qualifications and Promotions for consideration by the 7th Pay Review Committee of the UGC. EC discussed in detail the suggestions received from the members particularly the proposals related to change of nomenclature of Asst. Librarian as Assistant Professor, Deputy Librarian as Associate Professor and University Librarian as Professor and also their age of superannuation. The house authorized the President to finalize the same and put up the draft proposal on ILA website for further suggestions, if any, before the same may be sent to the Pay Review committee before the last date i.e. 30th September 2016.

Agenda Item No. 6: Decision regarding undertaking Library Automation Projects by ILA:

The matter of undertaking the Library Automation Projects offered to ILA from libraries was discussed in detail. It was decided that such offers will be evaluated and supervised by a three Member Committee, consisting of:

Dr. O.N. Chaubey,
Dr. Dharam Kumar and
Dr. Chetan Sharma.

EC authorized the committee to take the decisions in this regard from time to time as deemed fit to avoid the delay in action etc. Such decisions may be reported in the ILA Executive committee meetings later on.

Agenda Item No. 7: Approval of membership:

EC approved the membership of those who have applied from 1st April 2016 to 06th August 2016. EC decided that a membership Ledger should be maintained by ILA office. It should contain the record of membership as per the details provided on ILA website under Online Registration in addition to payment details.

The matter regarding '**Preparation of membership database**' on the web site was discussed. It was decided to take every precaution so that the data may not be mischievously modified.

Any other Item with the permission of Chair.

EC members discussed the matter of increasing the salary of Office person and approved to increase the salary of Shri Paramjit Singh Rekhi from Rs 10,500/- to Rs 11,500/- w.e.f August 2016.

The meeting came to an end with a vote of thanks to the chair.

Final Draft of Recommendations for UGC-Pay Review Committee

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS FOR DIRECT RECRUITMENT TO THE POST OF UNIVERSITY LIBRARIAN, DEPUTY LIBRARIAN AND ASSISTANT UNIVERSITY LIBRARIAN/COLLEGE LIBRARIAN

1. Qualifications for Direct Recruitment of University Librarian vs. Professor:

Disparity in UGC Regulations 2010, Clause 4.5.1 (University Librarian) and clause 4.1.0 (for Professor) with regard to qualifications for direct recruitment may be looked into and to remove the disparity, the following qualifications for University Librarian may be considered` :

- (i) A Ph.D. degree in the concerned/allied/relevant discipline.
- (ii) Master's degree in Library Science/Library & Information Science with at least 55% marks (or its equivalent grade where grading system is followed).
- (iii) A minimum of 15 years of experience of working as Assistant Librarian of which at least 5 years' experience as a Deputy Librarian in a University Library; OR 15 years' experience as Assistant Librarian in a University/College Librarian/Government approved Institution in an equivalent grade ; OR A minimum of 15 years of teaching experience with at least 5 years' experience as Associate Professor in a University/College/Government approved Institutions.
- (iv) ICT based modernization of library OR Research projects; Evidence of innovative library services and organisation of published work.
- (v) A minimum score as stipulated in the Academic Performance Indicator (API) based Performance Based Appraisal System (PBAS), set out in UGC Regulation 2010 (3rd Amendment, 2016) in Appendix III.

PI Note: A Deputy Librarian possessing the above qualifications will also be eligible for appointment as Professor in Library & Information Science.

2. Qualifications for Direct Recruitment of Deputy Librarian in a University vs. Associate Professor:

Disparity in UGC Regulations 2010, Clause 4.5.2 (for Deputy Librarian) and clause 4.3.0 (for Associate Professor) with regard to qualifications for direct recruitment may be looked into and to remove the disparity, the following qualifications for Deputy Librarian in a University are proposed:

- (i) Good academic record with a Ph.D. degree in the concerned/allied/relevant discipline.
- (ii) A Master's degree in Library Science/Library & Information Science / Documentation Science with at least 55% marks (or its equivalent grade where grading system is followed).
- (iii) A minimum of 8 years' experience of working as Assistant Librarian in a University OR as College Librarian/ Government approved Institution in an equivalent grade OR A minimum of 8 years of teaching experience as Assistant Professor appointed as per UGC norms and guidelines in a University/ College/ Government approved Institution in an equivalent grade.
- (iv) ICT based modernization of library OR Research projects; Evidence of innovative library services and organisation of published work.
- (v) A minimum score as stipulated in the Academic Performance Indicator (API) based Performance Based Appraisal System (PBAS), set out in UGC Regulation 2010 (3rd Amendment 2016) in Appendix III.

PI Note: An Assistant Librarian/College Librarian possessing the above qualifications will also be eligible for appointment as Associate Professor in Library & Information Science.

3. Stages of Promotion under Career Advancement Scheme (CAS):

Promotion of Deputy Librarian to University Librarian in AGP (10000): Disparity in UGC Regulations 2010, clause 6.4.8 (for Associate Professor) and Clause 6.6.5 (for Deputy Librarians) with regard to qualifications for promotion under CAS may be looked into; and to remove the disparity, the following qualifications are proposed:

Deputy Librarian/College Librarian completing three years of service in stage 4 and possessing a Ph.D. Degree in the relevant discipline shall be eligible to be promoted and designated as Librarian and be placed in the next higher grade (stage 5), subject to:

- (a) Satisfying the required credit points as per API based PBAS methodology provided in Table VIIIIX of Appendix III stipulated in UGC Regulations 2010 (3rd Amendment 2016), and
- (b) An assessment by a duly constituted selection committee as suggested for the direct recruitment of Librarian.

Provided that no Deputy Librarian, other than those with a Ph.D., shall be promoted or appointed as Librarian.

4. Pay Scale of Directly Recruited Deputy Librarians:

Disparity in UGC Regulations 2010, of Clause 6.3 (i) (for Deputy Librarian) and clause 3.0 (for Associate Professor) and with regard to pay scales may be looked into; and to remove the disparity, the following proposal may be considered:

Directly recruited Deputy Librarians should also be placed in the Pay Band IV of Rs. 37,400 – Rs. 67,000 with AGP of Rs. 9,000.

5. Age of Superannuation

Disparity in UGC Regulations 2010 in the age of Superannuation of Librarians and Teachers may be removed as stated below:

In the VI pay commission, the logic of not enhancing superannuation age of Librarian up to 65 years that “there is no shortage in the categories of Librarians” is far from reality, because more than 50% positions of Librarians in University Libraries throughout the country are vacant. It is therefore proposed that age of superannuation of Librarians may also be extended to 65 years.

6. Ph.D. Guidance:

Disparity in UGC Regulations 2010 regarding Ph.D. guidance by teachers of Library and Information Science and Librarians be removed. The following points are, therefore, proposed to remove the disparity:

Librarians should be allowed to supervise the Ph.D. Students so that the provision of Research and Academic Contributions as stipulated in Category III of UGC Regulation 2010 (3rd amendment, 2016) may be rightfully implemented.

7. UGC Research Projects:

Librarians like teachers of Library Science used to get Minor/Major Research Projects from UGC. Of late the same has been withdrawn for Librarians, thus hampering their API scoring. The following proposal may be accepted to remove the disparity:

Librarians should be allowed to take UGC Major/Minor Research Projects so that the provision of subcategory ‘Research Project’ as provided under Research and Academic Contributions Category III of UGC Regulation 2010 (3rd amendment, 2016) may be rightfully implemented.

8. Qualification for direct recruitment and promotion of Documentation Officers:

In the Fifth Pay Commission, the post of Assistant Documentation Officer was clubbed with the post of Assistant University Librarian/College Librarian vide appendix –II page number 32 of UGC Notification on Revision of Pay Scales, Minimum Qualifications for Appointment of Teachers in Universities and Colleges & Other measures for the Maintenance of Standards, 1998 The same post of Assistant Documentation Officer was somehow left out in the Sixth Pay Commission and UGC Regulations on Minimum Qualifications for Appointment of Teachers and other Academic Staff in Universities and colleges and Measures for the Maintenance of Standards in Higher Education 2010 as it was neither put at par with Assistant University Librarian/College Librarian nor was treated separately anywhere else.

Recommendations: It is, therefore, recommended that:

- (i) The post of Documentation Officer be treated as per the recommendation of 5th Pay Commission, that is it should be made equivalent to the post of Assistant University Librarian/College Librarian. Therefore, the minimum qualifications for direct recruitment of Documentation Officer be made equivalent to those of Assistant University Librarian/College Librarian.
- (ii) The pay scale of Documentation Officer should be made equivalent to those of Assistant University Librarian/College Librarian/ Assistant Professor, i.e. 15600-39100 AGP 6000.
- (iii) Documentation Officer be treated at par with Assistant University Librarian/College Librarian for promotion to the post of Deputy Librarian/Deputy Documentation Officer and University Librarian through direct recruitment as well as promotion under Career Advancement Scheme (CAS) subject to the eligibility condition as prescribed in UGC Regulations on Minimum Qualifications for Appointment of Teachers and other Academic Staff in Universities and Colleges and Measures for the Maintenance of Standards in Higher Education 2010.

Sir, it is humbly requested that the parity between the University/College Librarians and teachers, whose working conditions are almost akin to one another, may be restored to save librarian’s status from controversies as witnessed after V & VI pay Commissions.

- **IET announces the release of arXiv content in INSPEC**

The Institution of Engineering and Technology (IET) has announced that over 30,000 pre-print articles available in the online repository arXiv will be indexed in INSPEC, the leading abstract and indexing database for physics and engineering. The addition of these articles, which will take place by the end of this year, will substantially increase the content held in INSPEC, which currently holds over 16 million records, and deliver even greater access to cutting-edge research. Inspec is the first engineering and physics database to index arXiv records, which include open-access e-prints in a variety of disciplines such as Applied Optics, Physics, Astronomy, Circuits and Computer Science.

By including arXiv content in Inspec, researchers will now benefit from INSPEC's highly-curated, world-leading thesaurus, allowing users to query the records in a way which was not possible earlier. Tim Hamer, Director of Knowledge at the IET said, "The inclusion of arXiv records is a significant addition to INSPEC's already comprehensive database. This forms part of ongoing developments to the INSPEC platform, which will make it easier for researchers to pinpoint the exact content they need. "Our expert team of indexers will bring hundreds of person-years of knowledge invested in the IET's thesaurus to arXiv's pre-print content while the increased coverage and search functionality will enhance discoverability of arXiv's open access articles. Combined with INSPEC's existing content, which dates back to 1898, the arXiv content will help researchers develop an even greater understanding of the context of latest developments in their field."

- **MIT researchers attempt to read books without opening their pages**

It is nearly impossible to open certain ancient, fragile books without watching them crumble. But that doesn't mean the treasures will be locked away in those pages forever. MIT Media Lab scientists are trying to overcome the problem with a computational imaging system. This breakthrough lets them read the pages of a book even when it is closed.

The technology uses terahertz radiation, which allows scanning of the pages one by one through the cover. There is also a letter interpretation algorithm that can help understand incomplete text. The power and accuracy of the terahertz technology has to be improved. It is a major development because of the endless possibilities it offers historians and researchers of the near future. - **KU Select 2016 launched**

Knowledge Unlatched (KU), the global initiative for Open Access monographs, launches its next front list and backlist collections named as KU Select 2016. It offers 343 titles to libraries (147 front list to be published between November 2016 – April 2017 and 196 backlist published between 2005-2015) with 16 subject areas in the Humanities and Social Sciences. 54 well-respected scholarly publishers from 5 continents are participating in KU Select 2016. - **Government of India launched "Sugama Pustakalaya"**

To fulfill the provisions of the Marrakesh Treaty, Government of India launched "Sugama Pustakalaya": An e-Library for Persons with Visual Disabilities at New Delhi on 24 August 2016. The Web portal "SugamaPustakalaya.in" is an online library with over 200,000 books available in several languages and accessible in various formats for people with visual impairment and print disabilities. It integrates libraries across India and Globe including the largest international library-Bookshare.

Sugama Pustakalaya is a step towards an Accessible Digital India. It was launched by Shri Ravi Shankar Prasad, Minister for Law & Justice and Electronics & Information Technology at a function organized by Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities, Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment. The library houses publications across diverse subjects and languages and multiple accessible formats. It has been created by Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (Divyangjan), Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment in collaboration with member organizations of Daisy Forum of India and powered by TCS Access.

ILA organised One Day Seminar

The Indian Library Association organised a one day seminar on *"Relevance of Dr. S.R.Ranganathan in Digital Era"* at Pragati Auditorium, Administrative Block, Pragati Maidan, New Delhi on 3rd September, 2016. The seminar commenced with the 'Inaugural Session' with Prof. Dinesh Kumar, Vice Chancellor, YMCA University of Science and Technology, Faridabad as Chief Guest and Prof. P.B.Mangla as the Guest of Honour. The session was presided over by Prof. Shabhat Husain, President ILA.

Prof. Shabhat Husain welcomed all the participants and Guests, specially the Chief Guest, guest of honour, speaker Mr. Alton Grizzle, the highly prolific dignitaries and the huge gathering present in the hall. Prof. Husain, as the president of Indian Library Association apprised the audience about the current pioneering steps being undertaken by the association in order to make it more strong and commendable for the LIS Professionals in India. The design and development of ILA Website (database of members, editing the profiles, online registration of members, online election, outlook of the website, etc.), newer interface for JILA, ILA Newsletter, etc. and many other ground-breaking initiatives. The current seminar is also one of the series of events under purview. Talking about the validity of the theme of the seminar, Prof. Husain mentioned that the library science professionals should muse towards the legacy and the scientific temperament of librarianship which was envisioned by Dr.S.R.Ranganathan and the same comes into play when we talk of impact of ICT and its various ramifications on the services of the libraries.

The Guest of honour, Prof. P. B. Mangla while addressing the gathering, gave an illuminating visualization of Dr. S.R.Ranganathan and his contributions in the library science field. He made the audience spell bound by his eloquence and the experience of working with the late Legend of Library science, Dr. S.R.Ranganathan. He presented the whole edifice of library science subject in context of what Dr. S.R.Ranganathan perceived and mentioned that the core areas which he named as classics, are always protruding towards this great person, who contributed largely to recognize and made sense the social standing and dignity of the profession.

In his presidential address, Prof. Dinesh Kumar shared his personal experiences of the feel about the libraries and the services being provided by the library professionals. He pointed out that the libraries are paramount and imperative for any nation to have a strong system of libraries and library services to flourish and give life to education. He paid rich tributes to the great soul of Dr.S.R.Ranganathan and enlightened that his contributions in the field of library science profession are voluminous and expressed a great sense of virtuousness to this great legend in Library science. He stressed to work on the same frontlines laid by the personality to re-devise the system and echelons of librarianship by the help of modern methods of ICT based tools and technologies.

At the end of the inaugural session, Dr. Pardeep Rai, General Secretary ILA, proposed the vote of thanks to all present in the seminar.

The second session, Dr.S.R.Ranganathan Memorial Lecture, was started by a learned scholar from UNESCO, Mr. Alton Grizzle (Programme Specialist, Communication and Information UNESCO, Paris, France) and there was a great excitement to hear from a foreign speaker talking about the contributions of Dr.S.R.Ranganathan and the relevance of his philosophy in the contemporary era. Mr. Grizzle beautifully described the laws of library science on the basis of the different activities UNESCO is performing in the field of Information and Media Literacy. He explained in detail the five laws and correlates with the contemporary phenomena of information and knowledge dissemination at UNESCO and mentioned that the laws are valid for each and every aspect of services being performed and described some forms with the audience as well. The laws are very much in apt with the changing patterns of information seeking behaviour and are in tune with the changes being witnessed in library science profession, he added.

The panel discussion, the last session of the seminar was a fluorescent part of the program, which was chaired by Prof. Shabhat Husain followed by a fruitful question-answer sitting. The panelists were Dr. R.K.Sharma, Dr. Shailender Kumar and Dr. D.V.Singh, who discussed in great detail the validity and pertinency of the philosophical ethos of librarianship propounded by Dr.S.R.Ranganathan and the corollary in the current scenario of ICT spectrum.

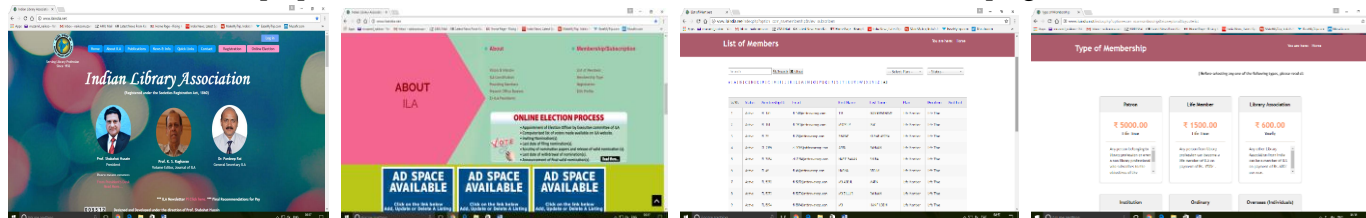
While welcoming the gathering, Prof Husain, presented an inclusive picture of the functioning of Indian Library Association founded in 1933 with about eight thousand members across the country.
