Professional News

- **UGC lists journals for granting academic points**

The University Grants Commission (UGC) has come out with a comprehensive list of about 38,000 journals that will be recognised for granting points under the Academic Performance Indicators (API) system to college and university faculty members who get their papers published in them. The journals span a wide variety of fields, covering areas such as engineering, agriculture, medicine, humanities and social sciences, environment, business and ecology. Henceforth, articles appearing in these journals alone will be considered for grant of API scores. However, the list is dynamic and not static. More journals can be added to it if universities provide us with any names of good journals left out.

A committee headed by UGC member Dr. V.S. Chauhan finalised the list. The API system awards points counted for promotion and also while applying for teaching jobs for publications, which are seen as a sign of an academic being actively involved in research.

A person gets 30 points for publishing a book brought out by an international publisher, 20 for a book brought out by a national publisher, 15 points for publishing an article in a refereed journal and 10 points for an article in other reputed journals. The UGC had decided to compile the list in view of complaints that academics were publishing in sub-standard, and sometimes paid for, publications.

- **Balbharati to use organic waste to print textbooks**

Paper made from wheat and sugarcane by products will now be used for printing Balbharati textbooks. The Maharashtra State Bureau of Textbook Production, popularly known as Balbharati, has decided to use paper made out of agricultural waste products to print over 10 crore state school textbooks from the 2017-18 academic year.

The bureau will scrap the present system of using wood base paper made of out of tree pulp. A professor from Nagpur, Arvind Sovani, had filed a petition in the high court in October, stating that the pulp paper used by Balbharati to publish textbooks was not eco-friendly and that they should opt for greener ways. In November, the court had ordered Balbharati to stop the tender process for pulp paper and issue a fresh one for environment-friendly sheets. Based on this order, Balbharati has decided to use agricultural waste-based pulp to make paper for printing textbooks.

Sunil Magar, director of Balbharati, said, "We have issued an all-India tender to procure paper made out of agro waste.

"Magar said the bureau requires 30,000 tones of paper per year to print the textbooks. "We will be using paper made out of agricultural byproducts like wheat and sugarcane waste from the next academic year itself," he added. Currently, Balbharati prints books in eight languages--Marathi, English, Hindi, Urdu, Kannada, Telugu, Sindhi and Gujarati. Until now, Balbharati had been using "virgin pulp paper" for printing textbooks and Sovani, in his petition, had said that this paper was hazardous to the environment as it required cutting of trees. Considering the number of textbooks printed every year by Balbharati and the virgin paper used for printing, there was a lot of damage done to environment, Sovani had said in his petition.

Neelakandan was a sincere, hardworking professional all through his life and an accommodating personality. The ILA joins in conveying the heartfelt condolences to his family members and pray God to give them strength to bear the loss. May God rest his soul in peace.

Superannuation

- After distinguished service, Prof Shalini R Urs attained superannuation after four decades of academic journey. Prof. Shalini started her career as an academic teacher at the Department of Studies in Library and Information Science, University of Mysore, Mysore in 1976 precisely forty years back. Thereafter, it was a remarkable journey for her in the field of library and information science. She has contributed immensely for the growth and development of LIS in general and more particularly for digital library movement in India.

She was always at the forefront in designing and developing MyDLIS (the term coined by Prof. Shalini for LIS Department of Mysore University to create unique identity) curriculum. The MyDLIS curriculum was far ahead of its time compared to other LIS schools in Indian Universities. The syllabus was always compiled with the current developments in LIS. It was MyDLIS which first introduced digital library, digital library practicum, and personal development and communication skill papers in LIS schools in India. Many LIS schools have used MyDLIS Curriculum as a model to develop their LIS Curriculum. Prof. Shalini's global outlook has helped MyDLIS greatly in having model LIS curriculum. Prof Shalini was one of the very few academicians who sensed the emergence of technology in a big way and its impact on LIS domain much before the Internet era. Prof. Shalini was instrumental in bringing 4th International Conference of Asia-Pacific Digital Libraries (ICADL), one of the biggest ever digital library conferences to India and organizing it for the first time in Bangalore. Report on TSLA Representation to JNTUH -V C & Rector regarding affiliated colleges Librarians' Ratification

On 11 January, 2017, Telangana Library Association represented by Prof. Laxman Rao, President TSLA, Dr Ravikumar, Gen Secretary, Dr Rupsingh Naik, Librarian, JNTUH, Librarians of affiliated colleges met Prof A Venugopal Reddy, VC, JNTUH and Prof NV Ramana Rao, Rector, JNTUH to represent the issues / grievances of Engineering & JNTUH affiliated college Librarians.

The main grievances discussed are as follows:

- To instruct the colleges to designate the College Librarian as Assistant Professor in Library and Information Science.
- To order every affiliated college to get compulsorily ratified the post of Librarian as Assistant Professor on par with other faculty.
- To instruct the colleges to recognize the librarians on par with the faculty of the college.
- To modify the Form A415 and shift the post of librarian from the OTHERS category to the faculty of Department of Humanities and Social Sciences.

The VC and Rector were very positive and agreed to look into the issues and sort them as early as possible. Prof. Ramana Rao promised to examine and make the librarians and library issues as part of college affiliation norms / regulations. Telangana Library Association are thankful to both VC and Rector for their positive response towards the problems of Librarians of the colleges affiliated to JNTUH. On this occasion, TSLA felicitated both VC and Rector as it was for the first time after they took over the charge of VC and Rector that the association met and discussed the issues with them.



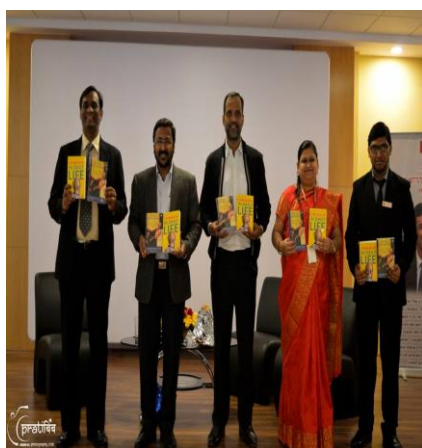
Report of Dr.Radhakrishnan Pillai's Book Launch on 05th January, 2017
