## Professional News

- 1) How private sector can play a bigger role in higher education :** To meet the huge demand for education that India is facing, private sector participation in higher education must not only be encouraged, but rather be incentivized. It is crucial that the government as well as private institutions coexist. In addition, the government must consider making regulations based on need and be objective-driven. This means that all higher education institutions in India must have a common regulatory framework, and not be divided on government versus privately-funded institutions, akin to a common corporate law that governs private and government corporations in India. <https://www.financialexpress.com/education-2/how-private-sector-can-play-a-bigger-role-in-higher-education/1307763/>
- 2) Class on wheels: Mobile van turns teacher for kids :** MUMBAI: Taking technology to the doorsteps of those who do not have access to the latest channels in learning, a mobile learning van is doing the rounds of Dharavi and its neighborhood. Students watch videos on the solar powered screen installed on the mobile van, on Friday. Nawneet Ranjan, the founder of Dharavi Diary, runs the STEM (science, technology, engineering and mathematics) van to inculcate scientific temper among students. The gadgets in the van run on solar power.
- 3) Simulation, a hands-on study tool at B-schools, takes centre stage :** The discourse in business education is changing. First came lectures by professors. Then the case study method which required students to get into class and take up position to debate and defend their decisions. Today, it is the turn of simulation-based study method. A newly developed simulation titled 'Honey Heritage,' for instance, looks at the complexities which come with family businesses and packs that into a game of action learning. Rajiv Agarwal of S P Jain Institute of Management Research, who authored the simulation, said here players must take decisions based on challenges that a typical business family faces over three generations. "In a simulation, one has to live with the consequences of one's decisions, and face the repercussions for over 8-10 subsequent steps. Also, one can see the impact of the decision in real time, which enhances learnings," he said. Vivek Chachra, country manager India for Harvard Business Publishing which offers 35 simulations, said, "Business simulation is increasingly popular as a classroom tool to both motivate learning and encourage students to be more active learners."

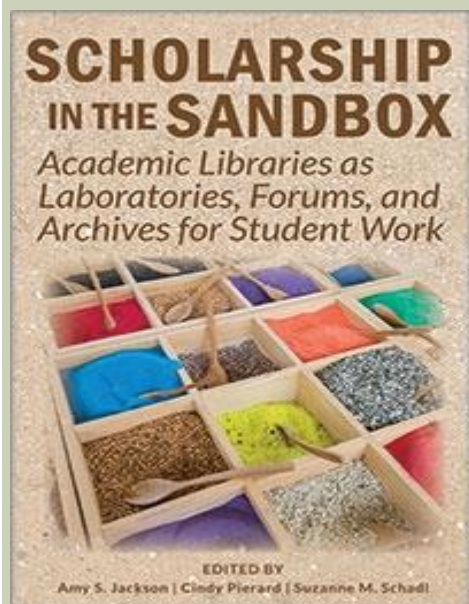
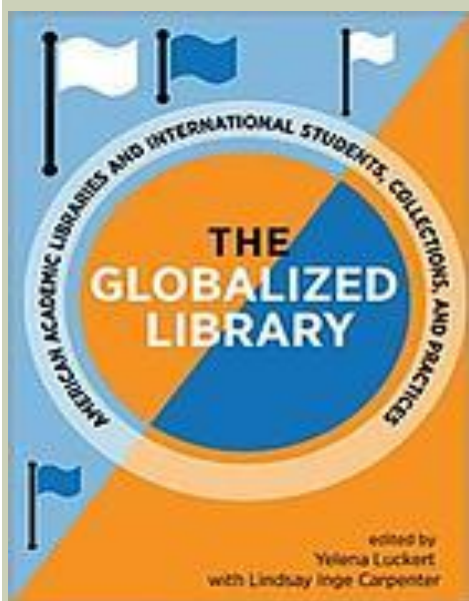

Many academic institutions count internationalization among their most important strategic goals and priorities: To be competitive, colleges and universities need to produce globally conscious graduates and assert their influence in areas of research and funding. As the center of campus life, academic libraries are integral partners to their institutions' missions and goals and are deeply involved in all aspects of the globalization efforts on their campuses. In five sections—Information Literacy; Outreach & Inclusion; Collections & Digital Humanities; Establishing Libraries & Services Abroad; and Career & Professional Development—*The Globalized Library* collects chapters from practitioners across North America detailing how their work has become globalized and demonstrating new ways to address language and cultural differences, the international purchase and processing of materials, professional development and growth of librarians, and information literacy needs of students from all over the world. It explores ways to provide support to students studying abroad, create online teaching tools, establish American-style libraries at satellite campuses, and leverage campus partnerships to create specifically designed programs and learning opportunities for international students, making a huge difference in the success and retention of a diverse student body.



### **Scholarship in the Sandbox: Academic Libraries as Laboratories, Forums, and Archives for Student Work**

Students are emerging scholars whose work should be recognized and shared along with work created by established scholars. Libraries are actively engaged with student-created content and encourage students to see themselves as producers, not just consumers of information. By shifting priorities, libraries should include student-created content in their spaces, and become participants in high-impact educational practices, increasing student investment in their learning, their engagement with scholarship at the institutional level, and their success and retention. These new priorities also open the library to new campus partnerships, making student scholarship and content a common goal.

### **Libraries to win Digital Minds and Analogue Hearts**

Two theories, I studied in my school science classes have greatly influenced me. These are Lamarck theory of Inheritance of Acquired Characteristics and Darwin theory of Survival of the Fittest. Darwin's theory in today's competitive professional environment can be rephrased as "It is not the strongest or the most intelligent who will survive, but those who can best manage change".

The buzzword here is adaptability or managing continuous change for the survival or to remain in the business. Last week only there was big news that, one of the largest travel corporate house "Thomas Cook" has closed down. Thomas Cook founded in 1841 grown to a large global travel group with annual sales of £9 billion with more than 19 million customers in a year and about 22,000 personnel working in 19 countries. The major reason for its closure was, they did not change with the time and were still following age old established business model. There are several such examples like HMT, Kodak, Nokia, Texla TV, Cali-cloth, Rajdoot Bikes, etc. The process incessant change and globalization of services will continue. We are witnessing blurring of traditional boundaries. At the same time new concepts, services and business models are emerging. Uber, OYO hotels, Zomato can be cited as a few examples.

Libraries can no longer work in isolation either geographically or by sector. Their existence is being regularly challenged by new services or products like Google, Wiki, Social Media, E-resources, etc. Indian Libraries cannot remain untouched with these phenomena. We have to keep reinventing ourselves, reshaping our services, redesigning our spaces and above all de-learn age old practices before adopting new models of providing information services. The biggest challenge is for Academic Libraries, who have to prepare themselves to meet the information requirements of Generation Z also known as i-generation (born between 1995 and 2019). This generation has started making use of smart-phones at the average age of 10.3 years. They have grown up with hyper-connected world, playing with mobile phones or tablets and extensively using social media. Academic Libraries need to win the digital minds and analogue hearts of generation Z to remain in the business. Tomorrows libraries need to focus on the user's experience, not only in terms of content, but also how the services look and feel within the four walls as well as online. They need to gather user data, with consent, to plan efficient and effective information services for the organisation. Library websites will need greater attention to turn them from purely functional devices to an easy, engaging and useful part of the library experience. Libraries should take responsibility to collect, curate and disseminate community or institutional created content. They should also act as publisher or disseminator of information and be part of Open Access movement.
