### 1) Vice President Venkaiah Naidu bats for Library in every village

Vice President M. Venkaiah Naidu expressed concern over the decline in book-reading habit especially among young people and called upon the educational institutions and the academia to inculcate the practice of reading from a young age.

Inaugurating the 21st North East Book Fair organised by the All Assam Publishers and Booksellers Association (AAPBA) here, the Vice President said that **students must be encouraged to look at reading as a fun activity rather than a chore.**

As many as 217 bookstalls, including one from Bangladesh, have been put up for visitors at the 12-day long event. He observed that with the advent of internet, children prefer to search online for information rather than rely on books. "Reading books, especially stories, is no longer the norm. Children prefer watching videos online," he said. Urging parents to serve as role models to their children, he said they should read books themselves so that the children emulate them.

According to an official release, he suggested that schools must setup reading camps and workshops.

'Wisdom gained from books is unparalleled' Naidu said that reading of books was a voyage through time and like having a conversation with the finest people. "The wisdom that you gain from these conversations is unparalleled," he said.

He observed that books have the power to inspire and motivate with stories of people who have fought against odds to succeed. "Books have the power to stir our creativity and stimulate innovative and inventive ideas," he added.

#### **Critical role played by library movement**

Referring to the critical role played by the library movement in different parts of the country, the Vice President called for keeping the legacy of the movement alive. "I strongly believe that for the society to benefit from books, there is a need to have one library per village," he said.

Apart from library, there should also be a common prayer room and a service hall in every village. He also suggested that book fairs should also be held at regular intervals in every district to promote reading habit. At the same time there was also need to promote quality books in terms of content.

### 2) **Open-source database enhances genomics research collaboration**

An open-source database of genomics variants in health and disease has been developed by Australian and North American researchers to simplify the sharing of this information between academics.

The MaveDB database stores data from multiplex assays of variant effect (MAVE) experiments, which systematically measure the impact of thousands of individual sequence variants on a gene's function. It was developed by researchers from the Walter and Eliza Hall Institute of Medical Research in Melbourne, Australia, as well as the University of Washington in the US and the University of Toronto in Canada. MAVE experiments provide valuable information about how genetic proteins function, how genetic variants may contribute to disease, and how to engineer synthetic versions of naturally occurring proteins that are more effective than the original protein.

Until now, MAVE data from experiments has either been uploaded to journal websites or provided on request to other researchers. This has made it hard for clinicians to access the data of other groups, or even know if a particular MAVE experiment has been carried out elsewhere in the world, hindering both collaborations and the progress of genomics research. Walter and Eliza Hall Institute bioinformatics researcher Dr Alan Rubin said: "MaveDB makes it easier for scientists to share their datasets in a single location, using a flexible format that is applicable to multiple research fields, and enables other scientists to easily access this data to enhance their research.

"We've also ensured MaveDB can 'talk' to other databases to add an extra level of collaborative capacity. For the growing field of MAVE research this database is an important step towards open science and reproducibility by ensuring data is made available." Alongside MaveDB the team developed a data visualisation platform called MaveVis, which makes it easier for researchers to understand and interpret the results of MAVE experiments.

Rubin said: "MaveVis provides an immediate and consistent display for MAVE data, including valuable annotations such as protein structure information, that will accelerate collaborative research." The research was funded by the Brotman Baty Institute for Precision Medicine, the US National Institutes of Health, the Canadian Institutes of Health, the Lorenzo and Pamela Galli Charitable Trust, the Australian National Health and Medical Research Council and the Victorian Government.

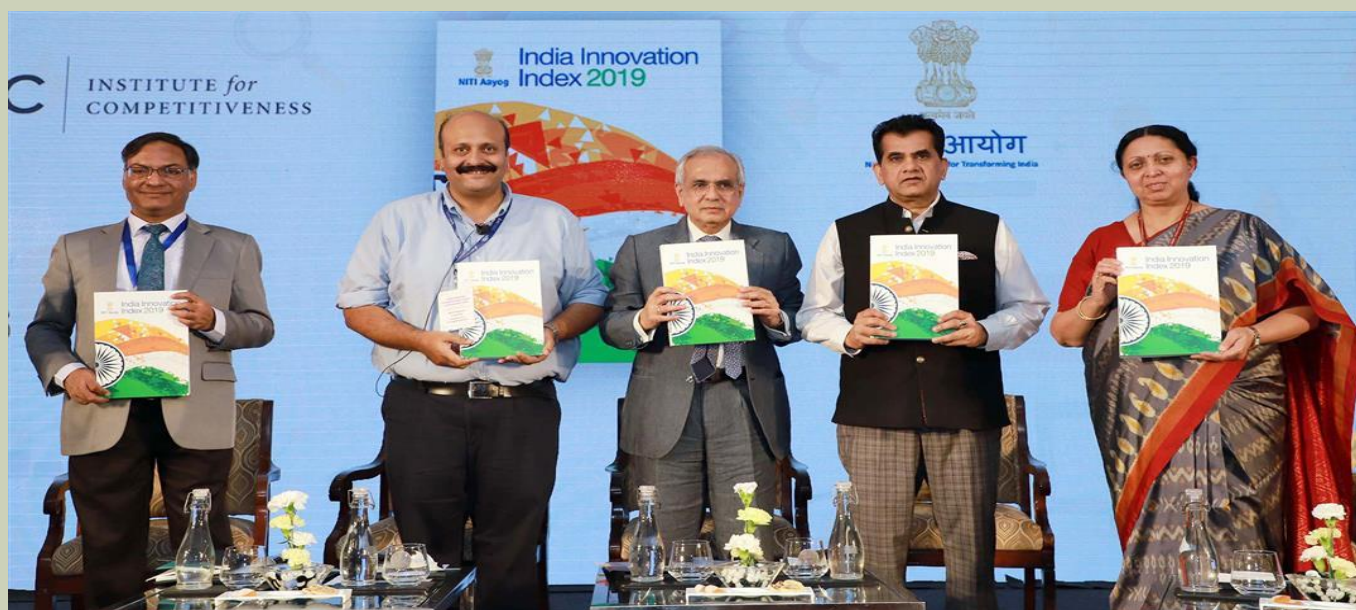

NITI Aayog with Institute for Competitiveness as the knowledge partner released the India Innovation Index (III) 2019. Karnataka is the most innovative major state in India. Tamil Nadu, Maharashtra, Telangana, Haryana, Kerala, Uttar Pradesh, West Bengal, Gujarat, and Andhra Pradesh form the remaining top ten major states respectively. The top ten major states are majorly concentrated in southern and western India. Sikkim and Delhi take the top spots among the north-eastern & hill states, and union territories/city states/small states respectively. Delhi, Karnataka, Maharashtra, Tamil Nadu, Telangana, and Uttar Pradesh are the most efficient states in translating inputs into output.

The index was released in the presence of Dr. Rajiv Kumar, Vice Chairman, NITI Aayog; Amitabh Kant, CEO, NITI Aayog; Ashutosh Sharma, Secretary, Department of Science; Renu Swarup, Secretary, Department of Biotechnology and Vaidya Rajesh Kotecha, Secretary, AYUSH.

Dr. Rajiv Kumar expressed hope that “the India Innovation Index would create synergies between different stakeholders in the innovation ecosystem and India would shift to competitive good governance.” Shri Amitabh Kant added that “India has a unique opportunity among its myriad challenges to become the innovation leader in the world.” Renu Swarup said, “cluster-based innovation should be leveraged upon as the focal point of competitiveness.” Shri Ashutosh Sharma said, “The index is a great beginning to improve the environment of innovation in the country as it focuses on both the input and output components of the idea.” Shri Vaidya Kotecha said, “The index is a good effort to benchmark the performance of the state with each other and promote competitive federalism.”

Searching Internet for academic and research: How to search, what to search and what not to search?

Most of the Internet standard search engines like Google does not provide access to more than 15-20 % web contents. So this 80-85 % web is called Deep Web, or Dark Web, or Hidden Web or Invisible Web. Most of the searchers or researchers including librarians do not know how to search deep web. Moreover everything available in internet is not authenticated. A researcher wants most relevant authenticated information for research. The libraries are the most important source of authenticated and relevant information. But libraries also have its own challenges too. 90% of Primary sources of information such as journal etc. is now digitized or born digital. Besides one may be subscribing 100s of online databases, may have created institutional repository, and online catalogue etc. So to deal with such complexities, a user wants Google like search but not Google search. So we need to look beyond Google surfing. Federated search and web scale discovery services combined with remote access are options to provide any time anywhere Google like search to users. Similarly to penetrate deep web you have various kind of Meta Search, academic search engines, Semantic search engines, and customised general search engines.

Librarians are domain experts in the field of Indexing , searching techniques and technologies. So they are the knowledge navigators to help researchers the most authenticated and relevant information from the information sea i.e World Wide Web. Therefore current role of librarians is more challenging. Users need libraries and librarians more than ever. However these librarians need to trained and orients themselves in latest tools and technologies. Search is the first step in research. So my dear librarians please understand it, prepare yourself for this new role. This will prove that Librarians are the best search engines in the world.
