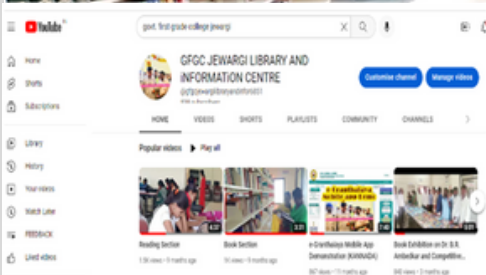

# FEATURE ARTICLE

## Library and Information Centre, Government First Class College (GFGC), Jewargi, Kalaburagi Dist. Karnataka State



GFGC Jewargi Library and Information Center aims at developing a comprehensive collection of materials in the various streams of the college like Arts, Humanities, Social Science and Science and Technology, giving vital support to teaching and research in the college. The library has grown over the years to be one of the best college libraries in the Kalyan Karnataka region. The library routine activities are fully computerized using e-Granthalaya 4.0 a cloud-based Integrated Library Management Software, with the adoption of barcode and QR Code integration in routine housekeeping activities. An exclusive library mobile app is being used by all library users to track their book circulation transactions along with the current status of the books in real-time. SMS and WhatsApp alerts are being sent to individual students to notify the happenings of the library.

The library has its own independent building, which is well equipped and well managed with an ISO standard infrastructural facility. Which was built under the 1.45 Cr. RUSA funds. The separate building is inaugurated on 5th September 2019 by Dr. Ajay Singh ji, Hon'ble MLA of Jewargi. The library is spread over a built-up area of 542 Sq. Meter provides a conducive environment for the readers. The library has a wealth of reading material, including more than 30,000+ books and print and electronic journals.

The library has an MOU with Gulbarga University Library to get access to resources of the Gulbarga university library. Apart from barcoding the physical books, the library has Bar-coded and QR-coded library members' ID cards to give quick access to library e-resources. An exclusive Telegram Group is being created to feed the current information to library users. Desktop Systems are placed to provide access to Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC). Internet CCTV/Surveillance Cameras are being installed as part of the anti-theft measure to avoid stealing of books and other library belongings. A separate ramp facility is provided at the entrance for differently abled challenged users. Fire extinguishers are installed to avoid fire incidents. 24X7 uninterrupted electricity and power backup facility. Separate Ladies' and Gents' Rest Rooms are available in the library. The library has incorporated newer dimensions to help students in acquiring excellence in their curricular and co-curricular pursuits of education.



The Library has Wi-Fi connectivity which enables access to free internet to the users on their own Laptops/Tabs within the campus, which also helps us to provide access to various subscribed electronic resources through Institutional memberships. Further, the college library has signed MoU with Gulbarga University to gain access to e-Resources subscribed by the Gulbarga University Library via remote login. Library orientation is being conducted periodically to users to become fully developed lifelong retrievers, evaluators, and users of information.



Library has established small Green Screen Multimedia Content Creation Studio with minimum hardware and software ICT infrastructure, which includes Ring Light, HD Camera, Boya Mic, ShortCut and OBS open source software for editing and broadcasting. It helps staff develop video lecture content, online classes, online meetings and also helps students to exhibit their talents on online social media platforms. This was found to be a unique initiative and practice among the Government College libraries of Karnataka.

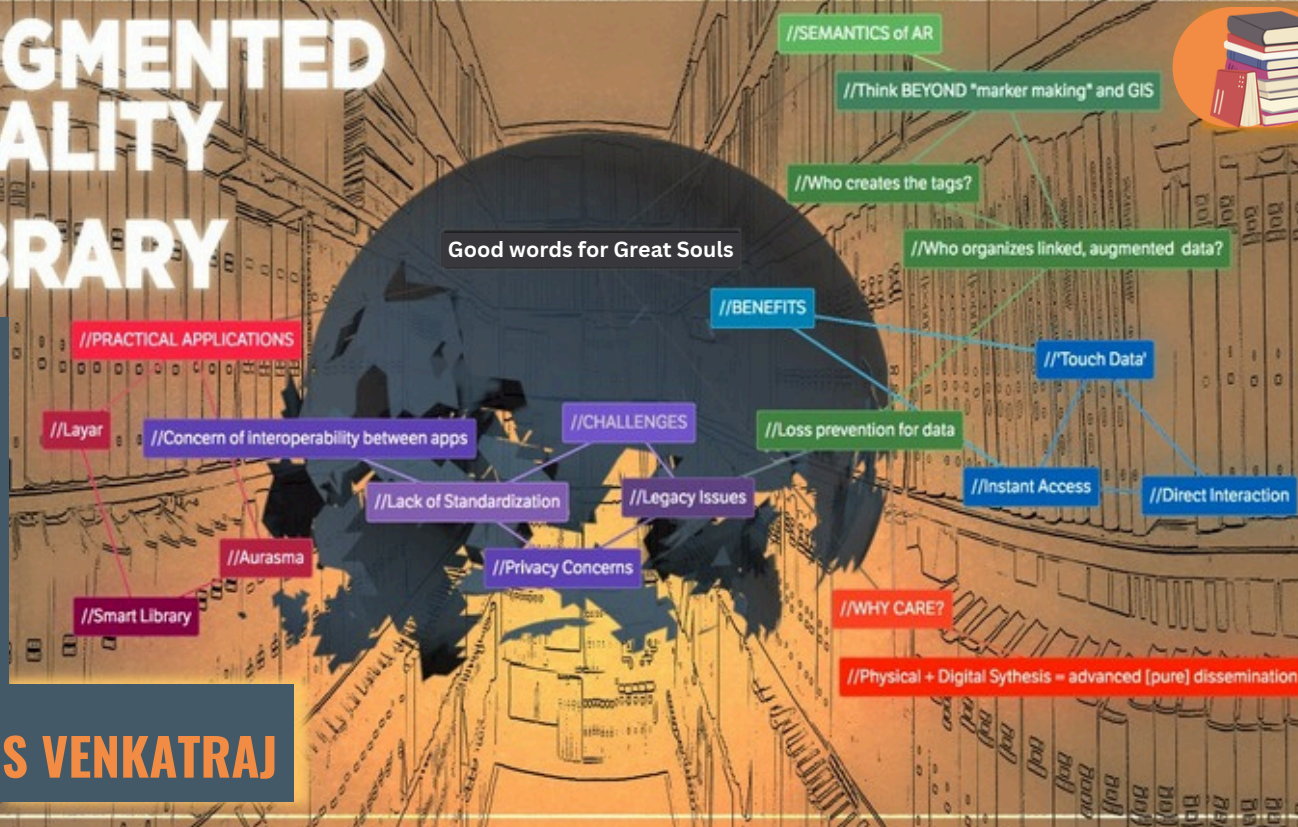

# AUGMENTED REALITY IN THE LIBRARY

## Augmented reality in libraries:

Augmented Reality (AR) is a technology that superimposes computer-generated images, sounds, videos, or other data onto the real world, enhancing one's perception of reality. AR combines virtual content with the physical environment, allowing users to interact with both simultaneously. It's used in various applications, from gaming and entertainment to education and professional training, including enhancing library experiences.

Augmented reality (AR) has significant potential in libraries, enhancing user experiences and supporting librarians.

Here are some examples:

**Locating Books:** AR apps like LibrARi help users find specific books by superimposing virtual information on the bookshelf, reducing the need for manual searching.

**Providing Detailed Information:** AR apps like myLibrARy offer additional information and reviews about media, enhancing user discovery and engagement.

**Suggesting Similar Books:** AR apps can suggest similar books based on user preferences, making recommendations more personalized and effective.

**Guided Tours:** AR-based apps can provide guided tours of libraries, reducing the load on librarians and enhancing the overall user experience.

**Maintaining Bookshelves:** AR apps can assist librarians in maintaining bookshelves by providing real-time information on book locations and inventory management.

These examples demonstrate the potential of AR in libraries, improving user engagement, information literacy, and overall library operations.

**Librarian-in-Black:** (Librarian in Black" refers to Sarah Houghton, who is known for her blog where she shares insights on library technology, digital services, and issues related to librarianship.) A Layer-based mobile app that allows users to take local history tours with augmented reality.

**New York Public Library's Find the Future:** A game designed to empower players to find inspiration for their own extraordinary futures by bringing them to historical sites and landmarks through augmented reality.

**ShelVAR:** An augmented reality application developed by the Miami University Augmented Research Group (MUARG) that uses the camera of a mobile device to read a bookshelf and flag books that are missing or misplaced.

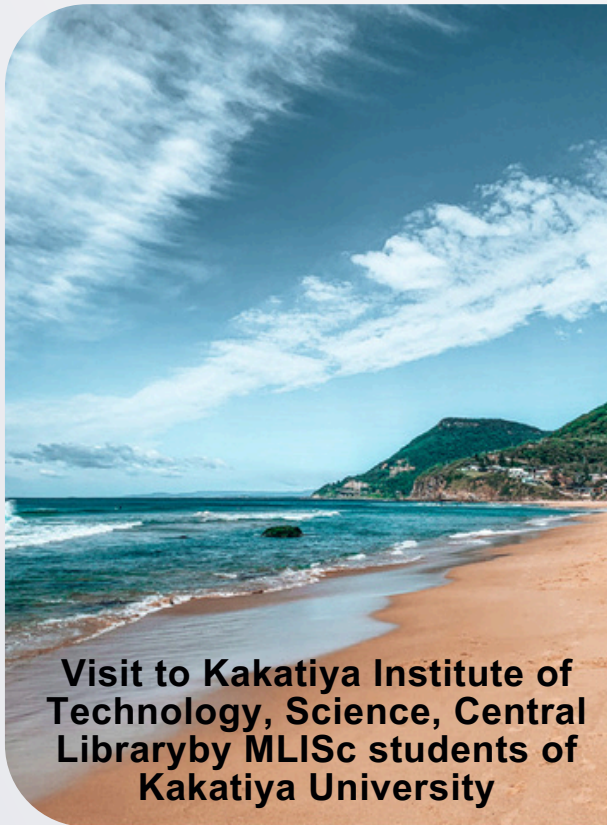
**Smart Library:** An AR app developed and tested at the Oula University Library that allows users to locate themselves in the library and find what they are looking for by using landmarks.

**Wolf Walk:** An AR app optimized for the use of mobile devices on the North Carolina State University Campus that allows users to explore the history of the university with a location-aware map and photo viewer for browsing historical content.

These examples demonstrate the potential of AR in enhancing user experiences and providing interactive information experiences in libraries.

**MILL CRISIS** by Curtis Brundy & Joel B. Thornton

The paper mill crisis, which is polluting the scholarly literature with fake papers, has led to record-breaking article retractions and continues to erode trust in science. While publishers and other scholarly publishing stakeholders have mobilized to address this grave threat to research and publishing integrity, action from the library community has been lacking. This article explores the ongoing impact of the paper mill crisis and its causes. It also reviews the steps being taken across the sector to address it. This includes actions taken by publishers, integrity sleuths and organizations like Retraction Watch, NISO and STM. Based on the severity of the crisis and the current response, this article recommends actions libraries can take to help address the crisis and clean up the mess paper mills have made in the scholarly literature. At a time of declining trust and growing threats facing society, it is critical that all scholarly publishing stakeholders, including librarians, help hold the line on publishing integrity and restore trust in science. Zenodo is built on open source software and was developed by the European Organization for Nuclear Research (CERN), the organization where the World Wide Web was also developed by Tim Berners Lee, but is open to researchers from everywhere. Zenodo makes scientific outputs of all kinds citable, shareable and discoverable for the long term.

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**Readers Digest UK edition is closed**

## Science Is Full of Errors. Bounty Hunters Are Here to Find Them ✦



### A new project is paying researchers to find errors in other scientists' work. The only problem? Even error hunters make mistakes.

"In 2010, two famous economists, Carmen Reinhart and Kenneth Rogoff, released a paper confirming what many fiscally conservative politicians had long suspected: that a country's economic growth tanks if public debt rises above a certain percentage of GDP. The paper fell on the receptive ears of the UK's soon-to-be chancellor, George Osborne, who cited it multiple times in a speech setting out what would become the political playbook of the austerity era: slash public services in order to pay down the national debt. There was just one problem with Reinhart and Rogoff's paper. They'd inadvertently missed five countries out of their analysis: running the numbers on just 15 countries instead of the 20 they thought they'd selected in their spreadsheet. When some lesser-known economists adjusted for this error, and a few other irregularities, the most attention-grabbing part of the results disappeared. The relationship between debt and GDP was still there, but the effects of high debt were more subtle than the drastic cliff-edge alluded to in Osborne's speech.

Scientists—like the rest of us—are not immune to errors. "It's clear that errors are everywhere, and a small portion of these errors will change the conclusions of papers," says Malte Elson, a professor at the University of Bern in Switzerland who studies, among other things, research methods. The issue is that there aren't many people who are looking for these errors. Reinhart and Rogoff's mistakes were only discovered in 2013 by an economics student whose professors had asked his class to try to replicate the findings in prominent economics papers.

With his fellow meta-science researchers Ruben Arslan and Ian Hussey, Elson has set up a way to systematically find errors in scientific research. The project—called ERROR—is modeled on bug bounties in the software industry, where hackers are rewarded for finding errors in code. In Elson's project, researchers are paid to trawl papers for possible errors and awarded bonuses for every verified mistake they discover.

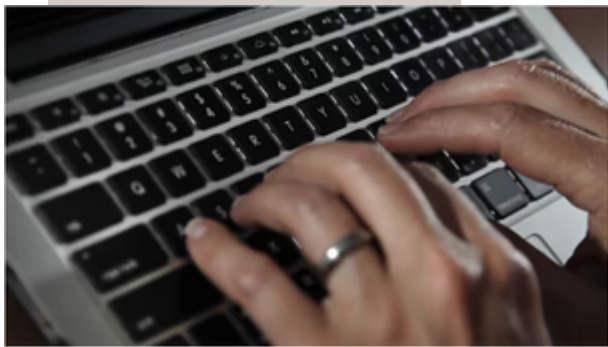
The idea came from a discussion between Elson and Arslan, who encourages scientists to find errors in his own work by offering to buy them a beer if they identify a typo (capped at three per paper) and €400 (\$430) for an error that changes the paper's main conclusion. "We were both aware of papers in our respective fields that were totally flawed because of provable errors, but it was extremely difficult to correct the record," says Elson. All these public errors could pose a big problem, Elson reasoned. If a PhD researcher spent her degree pursuing a result that turned out to be an error, that could amount to tens of thousands of wasted dollars.

Error-checking isn't a standard part of publishing scientific papers, says Hussey, a meta-science researcher at Elson's lab in Bern. When a paper is accepted by a scientific journal—such as *Nature* or *Science*—it is sent to a few experts in the field who offer their opinions on whether the paper is high-quality, logically sound, and makes a valuable contribution to the field. These peer-reviewers, however, typically don't check for errors and in most cases won't have access to the raw data or code that they'd need to root out mistakes."

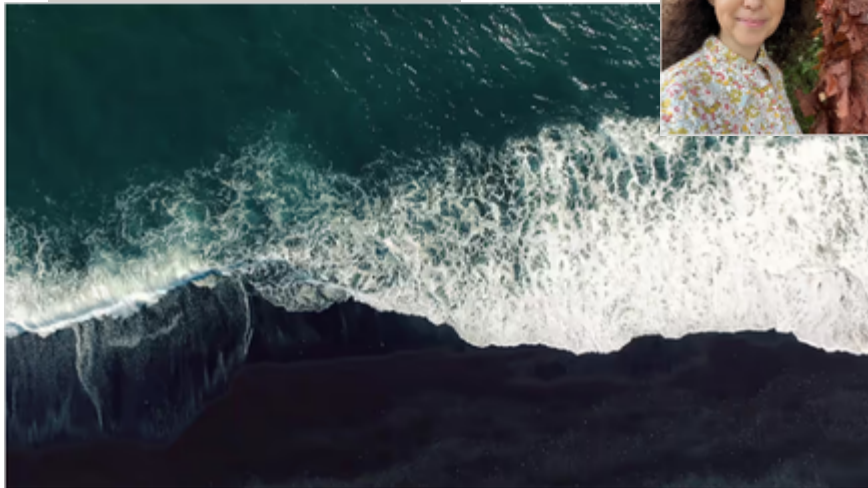

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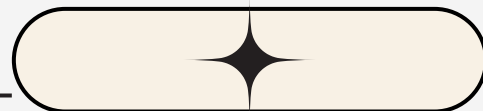
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
